What is a Six-Word Memoir?

The word "memoir" has the same root as the word "memory". In six words, only, the Six-Word Memory captures an important part of your life.

"Legend has it that Hemingway was once challenged to write a story in only six words. His response? "For sale: baby shoes, never worn."

Starting in 2006, SMITH Magazine re-ignited the recountre by asking our readers for their own six-word memoirs. They sent in short life stories in droves, from the bittersweet ("Cursed with cancer, blessed with friends") and poignant ("I still make coffee for two") to the inspirational ("Business school? Bah! Pop music? Hurrah")...."

How to write a Six-Word Memoir

Make lists of facts about yourself. For example: Where do you live? How many siblings do you have? What are your favorite things to do, favorite foods, etc.?

Then choose six words from your list to summarize some aspect of who you are or what you like. Try to mainly use nouns and verbs.


Homework

Make-up Work


- Responsibility of the student to make up assignments
