The Age of Reason and Rationalists

- The Age of Reason began in Europe in the late 1600s and went into the 1700s.
- It was a time for philosophers and scientists: rationalists
- Rationalists believed that people had the ability to think in an ordered, logical manner

Rationalist Beliefs (cont.)

God gave humanity the gift of reason – people had the ability to discover both scientific and spiritual truth

- People had the ability to improve their lives
 Improvements come through experimentation
- God was not only seen in specific places and times

A person could find God in all places at all times using reason.



Believed that the universe was orderly and good

- The best form of worship was to do good for others
- Beliefs brought about the need or desire to improve as a country
 - Political leaders were rationalists and deists
 - A time of revolution seeking freedom and independence
